

## Pro Grad Parent Meeting Minutes December 11, 2011

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM

### Old Business

The Secretary's report and the Treasurer's report were not read due to illness.

### New Business

Terrie made sure everyone knew that the date of Graduation has now been changed to Thursday, May 31. She advised us that she had made inquiries to the effect this would have on the ProGrad night, but did not have any firm information at this time.
